In *History for Tomorrow*, Roman Krznaric invites us to rethink the past—not as a dusty archive, but as a living laboratory for radical ideas.

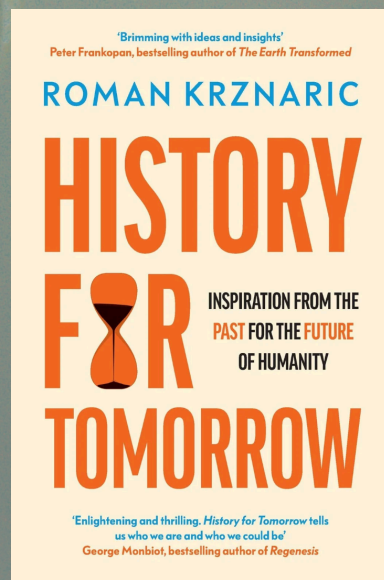
How did Edo-era Tokyo thrive with nearly a million people and minimal waste, thanks to a culture of deep circularity?
