Carnelian bead, fragment of an originally hexagonal bead with a prismatic cut. The bead is broken lengthwise into two halves, and the hole is clearly visible in the fracture surface.

The bead is also broken at one end.

The fragment is 13.2 mm long, with a thickness of 7.7 mm at the widest point, and 4.2 mm from the fracture surface along the bead hole to the faceted side.

Found when sieving plough soil (soil-sieving trench 2354),

Carnelian bead, orthogonal, round faceted bead, with almost rounded, hexagonal facets around the middle and pentagonal facets around the hole.

Length 8.5 mm, diameter 10.6 mm.

Stray find, coordinates: 1962,15/2072.

KØM 01699 x852

Carnelian bead, long cornerless tube with diamond-shaped facets on each of the four sides and with flat ends.

Length 8.4 mm, smallest width 6.1 mm, largest width 7.8 mm

Found in pit house (A12050).
